Nothing to report

McMaster-Megan

- Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) held a Case Management Conference (CMC) meeting re M-M on Jan 25/22
- In preparation, Don met with Jeff Wilker (Town and Region lawyer) and Jeff Markowiac (Town Planning staff) to discuss key issues for GWCA. All issues were accepted. Don agreed to share a common list with the Town.
- Based on guidance from Wilker, the GWCA should retain Party status for now. Wilker indicated
 there is virtually no possibility of GWCA being assigned costs when sharing a list of issues with
 the Town/Region.
- Received, edited/reviewed the Issues list provided by the Town/Region. I indicated that we
 would use the Town/Region list to reflect GWCA interests.
- For the CMC session, registered an intent to address three specific issues, i.e.,
 - i. The importance of establishing a Trail Head at north end of the property.
 - ii. Disagreement with the developer's offer of a buffer size.
 - iii. Need for a robust construction plan for installing the sewer line on Wildwood Rd.

Glen Williams Estates (GWE)

- Don completed review and rebuttal of GWE's responses to GWCA's issues with their plan.
- Don forwarded the GWCA review to Chris Sargent on January 10, 2022 with an offer to meet and coordinate actions.

Bishop Court - Phase 2

Larissa Howe, has offered to assist the GWCA on development reviews. She is a certified Town Planner currently working elsewhere in the Region of Halton.

Main Street Redevelopment Project.

- It appears to be more comprehensive than originally indicated
- By reviewing the notes re: approval of the contract award, the following is of interest:

BACKGROUND: In 2020, Capital Budget, monies were allocated and approved for the design of the Main Street (Glen Williams) Improvements in the amount of \$650,000.00. The project includes a stormwater management study for the Main Street (Glen Williams) study area, condition assessment and rehabilitation recommendations for Bridge 1 and Bridge 2 along Main Street over the Credit River, full engineering design and investigative services for reconstruction of Main Street and adjoining streets within the study area, and preliminary design of Confederation Street improvements between Main Street and Bishop Court.
