

GWCA 2026 ANNUAL PLAN

TRAFFIC & SAFETY – 2026 Resident Survey indicated this was the #1 priority tied with Development. Supports Incorporated Not For Profit Letters Patent Object – B (see appendix).

Objectives

- Work with residents, Councillors and Town staff to address on-going traffic and traffic safety issues using the goal of the Secondary Plan as our touchstone - "to preserve, protect, maintain and enhance the heritage character of Glen Williams"

2026 TRAFFIC & TRAFFIC SAFETY INITIATIVES – Lead Roger Stopford, committee members – Glenn Lowe, Kate Murray, Joan Griffin

- Continue ongoing communication and meetings with Councillors and Town staff to address each of the priority issues currently impacting the Glen and Glen residents: - ongoing
 - The need for a plan to accommodate anticipated future visitor/tourist parking needs given increasing visitor/tourist traffic in hamlet core
 - A confirmed strategy to route truck traffic around the hamlet rather than transiting through the hamlet, given continued heavy truck traffic. Follow on discussion will focus on optimizing the implementation of this strategy
 - Need for concrete next steps to address resident reports of traffic diverting onto side streets to avoid new speed bumps and driving at high speeds. Traffic measurement on affected side streets planned for 2026
 - The need for a plan to route anticipated future traffic volumes around the historic core rather than through the core, given future developments such as new housing construction and 413. Need to measure traffic volumes
 - Opportunities to counter the increased signage pollution in the hamlet
 - Ensure the upcoming reconstruction of Main St. and Prince St. delivers roadways that are consistent with the historic and heritage nature of the hamlet, including consideration of the usefulness of Heritage Conservation District status for the historic core

- Continue to engage with Halton Police to get their attention on reported heavy traffic and ignoring of stop signs, associated with the new housing developments
- Engage other Town hamlets and local businesses to build consensus on these initiatives

DEVELOPMENT - 2026 Resident Survey indicated this was the #1 priority tied with Traffic & Traffic Safety. Supports Letters Patent Object – B.

Objectives

- Act as stewards of the Glen Williams Secondary Plan (GWSP)
- Help residents understand all components of GWSP
- Liaise with residents about proposed or on-going development projects and communicate potential impacts to residents and landscape and character of the Glen
- Engage with the Town of Halton Hills staff and Developers in all aspects of the planning and development process for designated developments, ensuring the GWSP is adhered to

PARKS & TRAILS - 2026 Resident Survey indicated this was the #3 priority (tied with Communication and only a few points behind Community Engagement). Supports Letters Patent Objects A&C.

Objectives

- Work with Town of Halton Hills staff to ensure park areas and trails are maintained and are a recognized and important part of any developments in Glen Williams
- Partner with Town of Halton Hills Parks and Recreation Department to determine vision of parks and trails in Glen Williams to meet resident's current and future needs
- Consult with Credit Valley Conversation (CVC) and other groups about trail initiatives and Credit River stewardship opportunities for the Glen
- Educate members about park, trail and river issues and promote activities through the newsletter and other formats

2026 PARKS & TRAILS INITIATIVES – Lead - Joan – committee members – Sandy Gillians, Chelsea Griffin, Paul Griffin
➤ Adopt, Improve and Naturalize Shelagh Law Parkette • Renew Stewardship Agreement with Town for another 3 yrs. – April • Purchase pump to aid in watering plants - April • Replant for any winter loss – May • Create educational ecosystem signage for back of Kiosk (installation May 2027) • Purchase and plant last round ground cover plants on hill - fall • Continue to maintain gardens in Parkette - ongoing
➤ Partner with CVC for removal of invasive plant species from Shelagh Law Parkette – June 13
➤ Purchas permit to allow for Christmas season lighting of Shelagh Law Parkette - November ➤ Partner with Light Up The Hills to install lights in Parkette for the season - November
➤ Seek partners to establish a candidate plan to develop the Glen Williams Cenotaph as a park area complementary to the Shelagh Law Parkette at the south gateway to the historic core.

- Publish GWCA Newsletter with regular monthly cadence: promote GWCA initiatives, share hamlet news, stories and events and engage community
- Consistently use social media platforms to reach a broader audience: promote GWCA initiatives, share hamlet news and events and engage community

The objects for which the corporation is incorporated are:

The establishment and operation of a resident association for the purposes of:

A: Advancing the cultural and social interest of the residents of properties in a and around the Hamlet of Glen Williams in the Province of Ontario

B: Carrying on research and investigation into problems connected with the ownership and development of property in the Hamlet of Glen Williams

C: Promoting the aquatic, athletic, social and cultural activities among the residents of said area and such other complementary purposed not inconsistent with these objects
